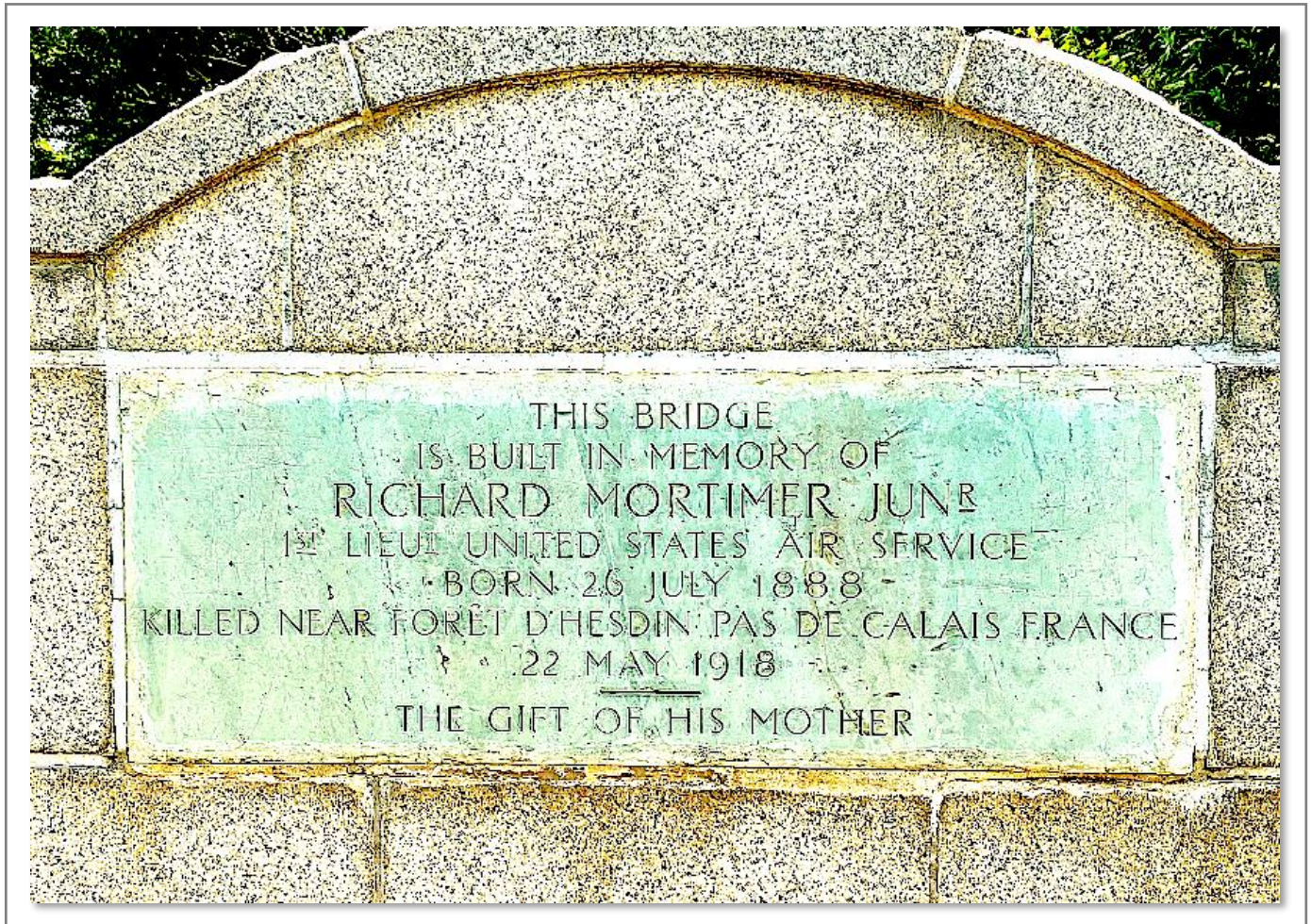

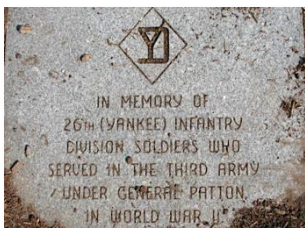

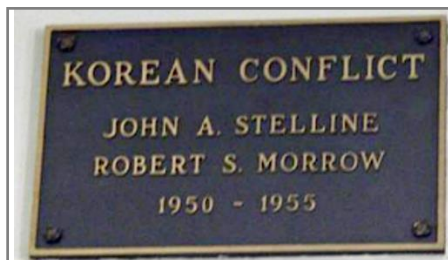

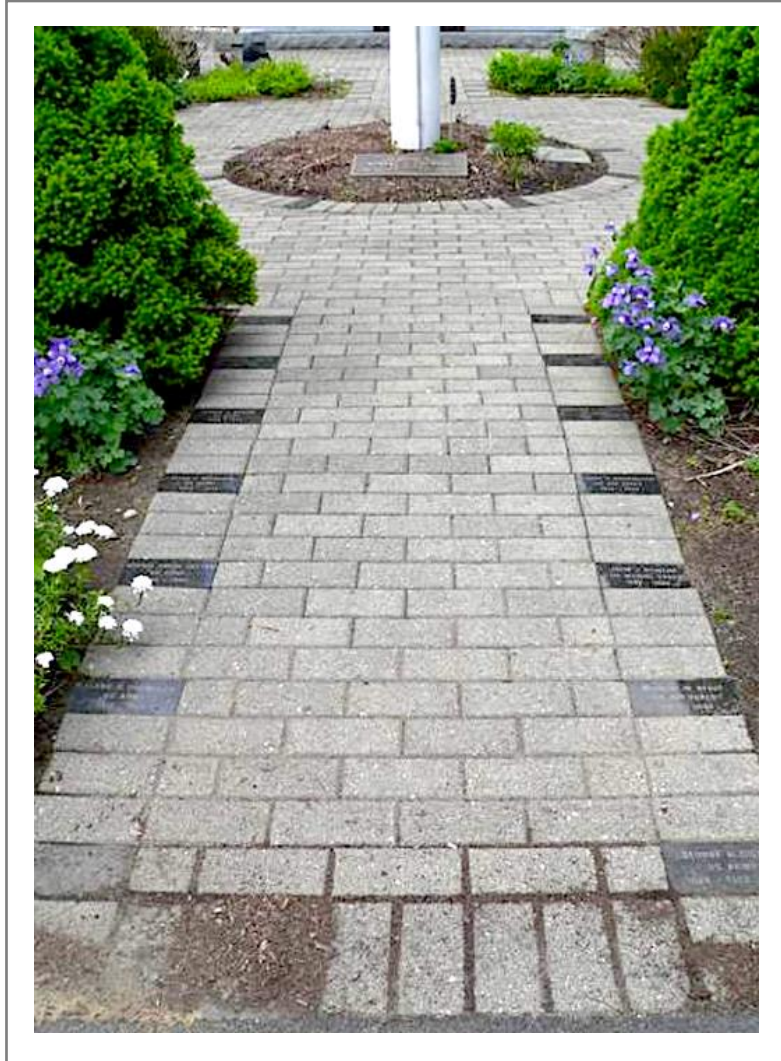

Engraved Paving Stones For Hamilton Veterans Who Departed From A Different Town (2010)



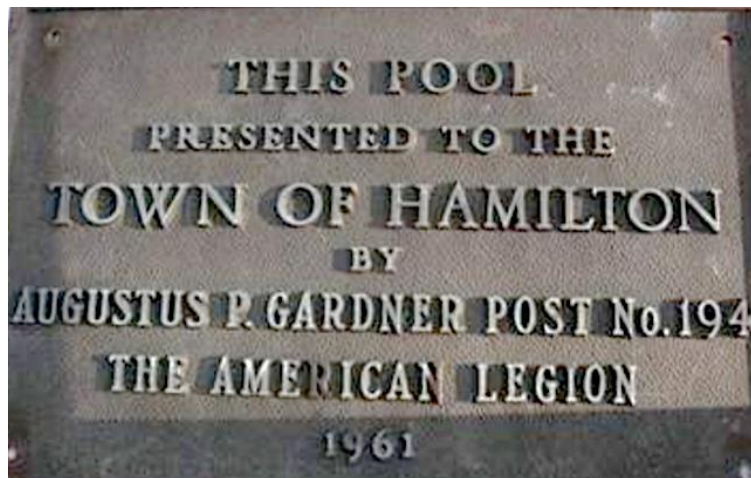

The World War II monument in Église, France, a tribute from the French people to American and French Soldiers who fought and died to liberate their homeland.

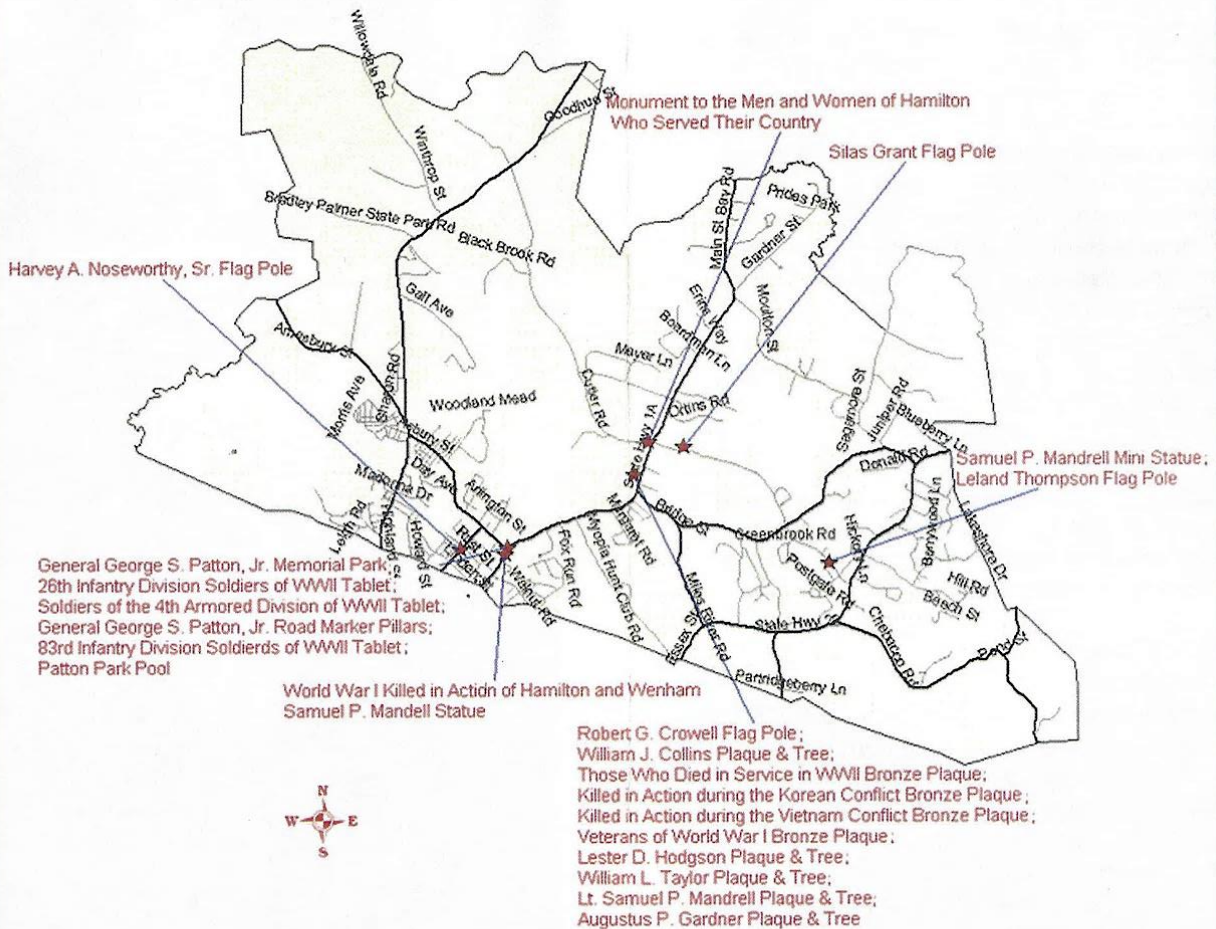

Hamilton Map of Veteran Memorials



Memorial sites are first plotted on a map of the city or town. In cases where there are many memorials in a small area, they will be plotted on ward maps instead of citywide. Then details regarding the memorials are uploaded to the site and accessible by clicking on the names of the memorials from the map. Details can be anything as simple as the name of the memorial and its location, to a full biography of the person being honored as well as the campaign served, when the memorial was erected, and many other facts.
